

The heavyweight, coated paper makes for a sturdy map that will survive a trip into the BWCAW (besides putting it in a map case). Good for planning routes along with Daniel Pauly's book "Exploring the Boundary Waters".

This map is ideal for planning trips to the Boundary Waters. Size is perfect for table-top planning, far superior to the free but crummy maps outfitters give away. This 1:70,000 scale (inch = 1.1 mile) map shows shows all portages and campsites, in exactly same locations as the five McKenzie maps needed for our trip, and it's more convenient than constantly shuffling five unwieldy McKenzie maps (inch = 1/2 mile) during planning stage. We will bring this one "planning map" along in the canoe as a back-up map to our five navigational maps.I already own four of these National Geographic Trails Illustrated maps for river and hiking trips (Arkansas, Glacier Nat'l Park), and these maps are excellent. Perfect detail, durable, I think waterproof or water-resistant, and they unfold/fold countless times without wear and tear.

Product is good, esp for overview of potential routes- if you spray it off with clear deck sealer it will shed water better and also float better.

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
