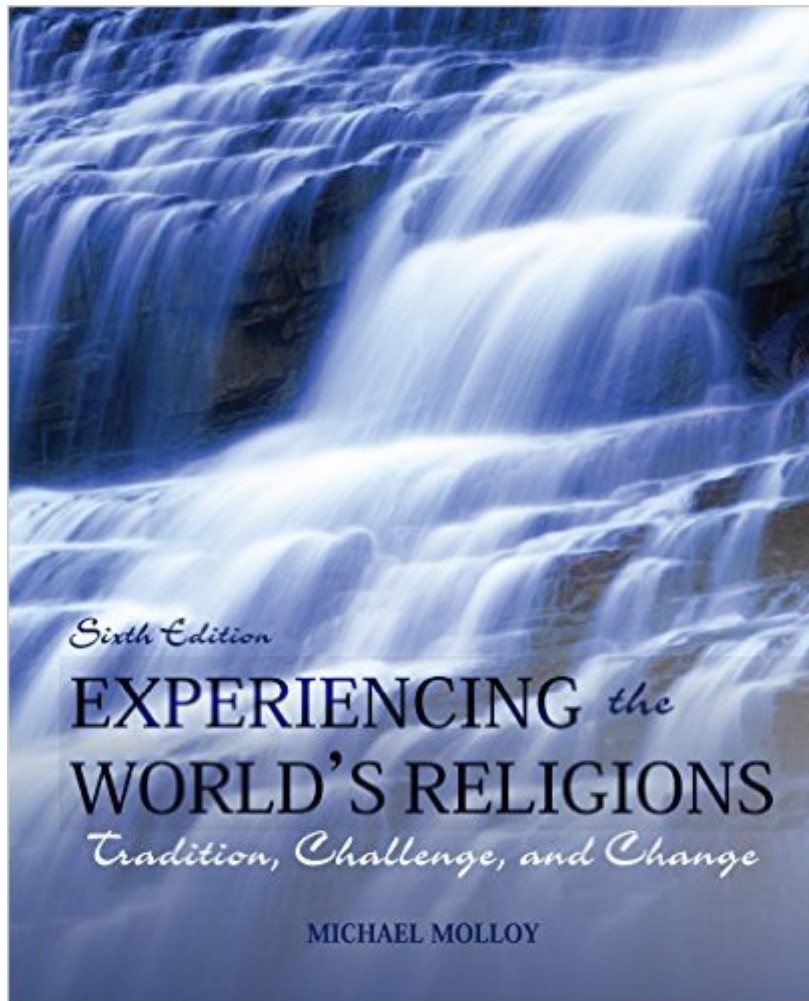

This book explains the religions that it covers well enough. You will learn plenty by reading it. There are some places where the author inputs his own political ideology, which is why it only gets 3 stars. If you can overlook that then it's written well and you will have no trouble understanding it. He's also into name dropping the names of dead psychologists, philosophers and artists. Why? I have no idea. Picasso's opinion of African masks has next to nothing to do with the topic of the religion. This is a loose leaf book. A note: There's almost no difference between this book and the one that came before it. The main difference was the images. I bought this and compared it to a scan of the previous edition that I found online and I was unable to find any significant differences. That said, I manage to get this pretty cheap when lowered the price for one day, and I sold it back to the university bookstore for 80% of what I paid for it. Needless to say, I was satisfied with that arrangement. Apparently the bookstores don't always buy these loose leaf books. did not offer me anything for it. I ended up not even needing it.

I ordered this knowing that this was a looseleaf textbook. It was all great until I actually put it in a binder. I kept ripping the pages out. THEN, I found out you can spiral bind textbooks (up to 3 inches) over at Office Depot. I went ahead and called to double check and they did!! spiral bound 2 textbooks for 7.50 (with Nevada state tax) After that, I have a perfectly awesome cheap textbook (:

on my Note 2, which is a tablet format, i CANNOT download this textbook to my device. it will recognise my PC Kindle app, but not the Note 2/Tablet. so basically the "Compatible Devices" claim is false advertisement. imagine my disappointment when i realized that i will NOT be able to access the convenience of reading my homework assignments while on the go, & that i'll have to pay much more for even a rental than i could have by being able to read it on Kindle, on my Android Note 2!!! & to think, i thought i would be getting all my textbooks from eBooks in the future - i guess that's just money they'll never make from me...their loss...

It's entirely possible I mis-read the description, I'll state that up front. However, I ordered this as a textbook rental and was shocked to receive a shrink-wrapped loose-leaf book. On top of that, it's not even a standard size, and the TWO holes are in the top 2/3 of the book. WTF? Where on earth am I going to find an empty notebook that can even hold this?

This is a standard college level Survey of World Religion book, and does a good job of disseminating the info you need to know without being terribly dry. I read a good eighty percent of this for my class, and the tone of the book is not overtly preachy nor is it watered down. I did take issue with some of the PC speak in the book, but at a collegiate level, that's to be expected. All in all, not a bad book.

I think the book as a teaching tool is fine; but when I receive the book it was missing over 75 of its loose leaf pages. I am returning that copy and am going to try again because I need it for class. ... I am not a fan of the loose leaf form of this product either. The holes are not reinforced so they rip easily; and as other reviewers have noted, the product only has two hole punches. The size of the product suggests a small binder, but you cannot put the book into that size binder because of the number and layout of the hole punches; but in a large binder the pages really stay loose-- probably leading to the ripping of pages I mentioned before.

I bought this book for my World Religion class, although we never really used it much. Still helped me though! Only bad thing about the book was that it was 3-hole punched and it ripped multiple times out of my binder.

I didn't read the reviews, because it didn't matter anyway, I needed this book ASAP for school. The overall layout is nice, but the pages are pretty thin(I'm scared I'm going to rip them everytime I turn

the page) AND it's not even bound. What!? Why?! I think it's pretty ridiculous someone thinks it's okay to charge what they are for a pack of loose leaf thin pages. I had to pay another \$10 to have it spiral bound. Highway Robbery especially if you're a student, like we don't have enough to pay for! To title it paperback is completely false. I only gave it two stars for layout.
