This book was really fun to read. The author did a good job with the dynamic of the two main

characters of this book. However the only downfall is that it is a prequel for Keo before he meets up with the group from the rest of the series. I liked getting background on the character but it was just a distraction. You are supposed to read this before book 4 of the series, I would just wait until you have the rest of the series before picking this one up.

Hmmmm. I would read this series of books 1-3, The Keo Storyline, 4-6 and so on, I think. It was also enjoyable the way I read them, building up the suspense reading 1-6 then discovering this book existed, and filling in the blanks...like an added treasure map find! (Can't wait for 7!!) Thinking of rereading one of the books to better understand things I might have missed and not realized the importance of certain things...but either way you decide, you can't go wrong! It's an awesome series!!! Really glad this character's life challenges & personality was shown to the reader, before and after "the end of the world"! Of all the books in the series so far, this is the only one I thought got a little too "unrealistic", though I still enjoyed it & this book wasn't included in either book series set (I found it by accident) was the reason I gave it a 4/5.

Keeping up the (very) high adrenaline, action-packing, barely-breathing style, Sam Sisavath introduces a new character that we can expect to play a role in the main series. This offshoot is definitely worth reading, although as I go through the series, I do see some repetition of scenarios that characters find themselves in. Still, this is a great and highly entertaining series with strong dialogue and characters.

I read Keo's story line after reading book 6 of the Purge of Babylon series and still enjoyed it just as much as the main story line. Of course all of the women are beautiful and the men are harder to kill than even the blue eyed ghouls, but everything about this entire genre requires an adept ability to suspend one's belief. Besides, beautiful women - good, guns - good, beautiful women with guns - really good. It's just a fun, easy read if you're into the whole apocalypse thing. Even though the ending is written to weave into book 4, this book can be read as stand-alone without reading the main series.

A departure from the characters we've been following in the series so far, which is both good and bad. This isn't your entry into the series if you're new, it's an established world, just new characters with all new storylines.

I read the 4th and 5th books in the Purge of Babylon series before reading this book but I'm so glad to have gotten Keo's backstory! It makes everything more understandable and I loved to get to know Keo better. I've now read a total of 6 books in this series and am just as impressed now as I was at the beginning. An excellent series by an excellent author!

I guess the running joke of Keo never got old for me. I like that he basically becomes a bit of the anti hero. Looking forward to the next book. Character development in this book was good just like the first three books. Can't wait to start the next one.
